# RCRC Welcomes San Luis Obispo County to Membership

**SACRAMENTO, CA – February 01, 2016** – The Rural County Representatives of California (RCRC) has officially added San Luis Obispo to its membership, bringing the number of member counties to thirty-five. The RCRC Board of Directors unanimously approved the addition at their January 2016 meeting. Supervisor Lynn Compton will serve as the delegate on the RCRC Board of Directors representing San Luis Obispo County.

“We are pleased to welcome San Luis Obispo County back to RCRC,” said John Viegas, RCRC Chair and Glenn County Supervisor. “Our collective voice on issues impacting California’s rural counties can only be strengthened by their membership, and we look forward to them joining our continued efforts to champion rural policy in Sacramento and Washington, D.C.”

Representing more than half of the state’s total number of counties (58) and more than half of California’s landscape (55 percent), nearly one in 12 Californians now reside in RCRC’s rural counties. RCRC provides the rural county perspective on a myriad of issues throughout the state and federal legislative and regulatory processes including land use, water and natural resources, housing, transportation, wildfire protection policies, and health and human services.
