



# Electric Transportation: What does your community need?

The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) is seeking input from your community!

California has set aggressive goals to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. A key way to meet those goals is through increasing the use of electricity as a transportation fuel. Electric utilities, including PG&E, have proposed several programs to speed up the adoption of electric vehicles for personal use, as well as for mass transit agencies and large fleets for trucking and delivery services. The CPUC is looking for the public's input on these proposed programs at an upcoming meeting in Richmond.

CPUC Commissioner Carla J. Peterman and staff will briefly outline the utilities' proposals, then ask community members about their concerns and expectations. Here is your chance to have a say on the future of transportation in your community.

**Background:** On January 20, 2017, Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Southern California Edison Company, and San Diego Gas & Electric Company each filed an application with the CPUC to request approval of a portfolio of investments in transportation electrification. The utilities filed the applications in response to Senate Bill 350.

In total, the utilities have requested approximately \$1 billion in funding to implement these proposals over several years. The majority of requested funding is to provide infrastructure to the medium- and heavy-duty sectors.
