### **California Natural Resources Agency**

Wade Crowfoot, Secretary, California Natural Resources Agency (CNRA), addressed the RCRC Board of Directors on the 2024-25 State Budget outlook and potential impacts on key CNRA programs, the 2024 water outlook, an update on the 2024 forest resilience plan, and efforts by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife.

### **Water Issues Update**

After consultation with the RCRC Officers, RCRC staff recommended the RCRC Board of Directors adopt a "No Position."
