The Decade of Drinking Water Solutions

The past decade has brought us extended drought, the Human Right to Water, the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act, the creation of the Safe and Affordable Drinking Water Program, and a reorientation of the Irrigated Lands Regulatory Program on groundwater quality and safe drinking water. The coming years will be shaped in large part by efforts to implement these initiatives of the past decade.

On the doorstep of a new decade, NCWA and the Sacramento Valley Water Quality Coalition have assembled a panel of speakers central to implementation of key components of these initiatives, including the risk assessment and needs analysis elements of SB 200, the nitrate and salinity priorities of CV-SALTS, and the latest research modelling that characterizes agriculture's probable contributions to groundwater quality.
