RE: Senate Bill 37 – REMOVAL OF OPPOSITION As Amended September 3, 2021

Dear Senator Cortese:

On behalf of the Rural County Representatives of California (RCRC), I am writing to remove our opposition to your Senate Bill 37 regarding the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). RCRC is an association of thirty-seven rural California counties, and the RCRC Board of Directors is comprised of elected supervisors from each member county.

Formerly, SB 37 would have prohibited use of CEQA's "common sense" exemption for projects on sites listed on the state's Cortese List. RCRC was concerned that the bill would have added additional costs and delays for a large universe of minor projects at potentially thousands of sites on the Cortese List. We believe the amendments adopted in Assembly Appropriations Committee and on the Assembly Floor substantially improve the bill to avoid these unintended consequences while still protecting public health, safety, and the environment.

For these reasons, we are pleased to remove our opposition to your SB 37. We look forward to working with you in the future to continue to refine the Cortese List and address contaminated sites throughout the state.
